Demetriou forecasts that the pace will quicken, especially in the lead up to the 2032 Olympics in Brisbane.

"It's a privilege to join ASTN and this role is a great opportunity to work closely with Australia's leading startups in the sports sector. Australia offers a truly connected Sports Innovation ecosystem unlike anywhere else in the world and I'm excited to be at the forefront of that innovation accelerating Australian-inspired sports technologies," said Vale.

"We have a strong leadership team that is genuinely passionate about helping Australian sports technology companies to scale-up and empower them to have a global brand and international vision."

Priestnall will take the lead on a newly created role of Alumni Office Manager. Priestnall joins ASTN with more than 17 years of experience in project management and client services working with national sporting and not-for-profit organisations, including roles at GameDay, National Rugby League and Tennis Australia.
